MARCH 19 ANNUAL MEETING AND BOD ELECTION

Mark your calendars for our March 19 Annual Meeting, which will be a combination online and limited in-person event for the second year in a row.

CU Ballot, the independent third-party that has conducted our recent Board of Directors balloting and virtual Annual Meetings, will also administer this meeting. The meeting will be called to order at 5 p.m.

Primary members may log in to the meeting at a secure site that will be announced soon. Members must fill in their account/member number and last four digits of their Social Security Number. All primary members in good standing (at least \$5 in a savings account) are welcome to virtually attend.

The in-person gathering is scheduled to be held at APFCU's corporate offices, 3465 Waialae Avenue, 4th floor. Space is limited to allow for adequate social distancing. A tentative total of 25 in-person attendees will be required to RSVP through a system that will be announced on our website. No food or drinks will be available.

Virtual meeting attendees and in-person attendees will be eligible to win prizes in a random drawing.

Voting will be administered by CU Ballot. Primary members 18 and older and in good standing would be able to vote in one of four ways: at a branch, online, by phone, or through a paper ballot (when requested by phone).

- Voting would conclude by 4 p.m. March 19 Hawaii Standard Time.
- Final election results tabulated by 4:15 p.m. HST, and the newly elected BOD members will be announced at the Annual Meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT TO BE PUBLISHED IN FEBRUARY

Aloha Pacific FCU's Annual Report, which includes management's message on the achievements of 2023 and the outlook for the future, financial statements, and minutes from last year's Annual Meeting, is scheduled to be available by mid February.

SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE ONLINE THIS MONTH

Our scholarship program is now in its 37th year, offering our primary members a financial boost as they pursue their higher-education goals.

There are two awards programs:

- The Wallace Y. Watanabe Excellence Award, now in its second year, is a \$5,000 scholarship for the most outstanding applicant. This award honors APFCU's former president and CEO who served the credit union for more than 41 years, retiring in 2013. He passed away in September 2020.
- The Masami Oishi Memorial Scholarship program awards \$2,000 each to 15 recipients. Oishi was the credit union's first manager and retired as president and CEO in 1992. He passed away in 2003.

Beginning this year, the Aloha Pacific Foundation will fund the scholarships, but the application process will not change.

A volunteer panel of APFCU members judges the applicants based on:

- financial need
- academic achievement
- community service and extracurricular activities, which may include employ-

ment, sports and recreation, arts, clubs, etc.


The application will be posted at *alohapacific.com* in January. In addition to the completed application, official transcripts, a one-page letter of intent and a resume are required.

The complete package must be postmarked or delivered to a branch no later than Saturday, April 20. Applicants may direct their schools to mail official transcripts directly to APFCU in sealed official envelopes or email a link to the official transcripts, generally requiring a password, to marketing@alohapacific.com.

Please note that scholarship awards are restricted to one award per primary member per lifetime so that we may assist as many members as possible. Awards will be sent directly to the recipients' schools.

Eligibility requirements include:

- APFCU primary membership in good standing: at least \$5 in your savings account and no loan delinquencies for at least one year prior to July 21, 2024 (joint account owners and family members who are not primary members are not eligible)



- Enrollment full time in an accredited program, such as an associate, baccalaureate or graduate degree

Recipients must be available in mid to late summer for picture-taking and to pick up their awards. Pending health guidelines, recipients may be asked to submit high-resolution portraits instead.

Some restrictions apply. See scholarship application for details. Aloha Pacific Foundation is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) of Aloha Pacific Federal Credit Union.

To earn this 5.00% APY rate, fulfill these monthly requirements:

- Use your debit card to make at least 12 purchases
- Post at least one electronic (ACH) deposit or withdrawal
- Enroll in Online eStatements
- Log in to Online or Mobile Banking at least once each month (must log in at least 2 days before the end of the month)

If the monthly requirements are not met, the APY will be 0.03%.

All these requirements are waived for the first three months when you open your new account!

Tax season will be here before we know it, so please note: You can still make 2023 IRA contributions up until the April 15, 2024, tax filing deadline. For those under 50 years old, the limit is \$6,500. For those 50 and older, the limit is \$7,500. Contributions apply to both traditional and Roth IRAs.
